Helpful hints for presentations...	Helpful hints for infographics...
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Less is More: Don't put too much on a slide (it's ok to have more than one slide) and use concise bullet points (not complete sentences or paragraphs). ● Visuals are Powerful: Have color/images but be careful of choices for readability. ● Continuity improves Recall: Try to create continuity between your presentation & infographic ● Readability is Imperative: Everything should be legible on a small screen (be careful with font type and size) ● Proofread! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Less is More: Key ideas should be prominent and uncluttered. ● Visuals are Powerful: Lean into visuals that can convey meaning ● Continuity improves Recall: Try to create continuity between your presentation & infographic. ● Readability is Imperative: Limit word use to only the most necessary, but make sure it's understandable and a clear reminder. ● Proofread! ● Tech Rec: Canva is a great tool for creating infographics! You can also use Google Slides. With either, you will be able to download the image as a PNG.
